#### Bernhard Heiden

Bernhard Heiden, born in Frankfurt am Main in 1910, received his musical training at the Hochschule für Musik in Berlin where he studied with Paul Hindemith from 1929 until 1933. In 1935 he came to the United States and settled in Detroit where he was active as composer, arranger and teacher. In 1942 he founded and conducted the Detroit Chamber Orchestra. During World War 11 he served as Assistant Band Master with the 445th Army Service Forces. He received his M.A. degree in Musicology from Cornell University in 1946 and in the sameyear joined the faculty of the Indiana University School of Music where he served as Professor of Music and longtime chairman of the Composition Department until his retirement as Professor Emeritus in 1981.

Mr. Heiden is the recipient of numerous prizes, grants and commissions, including the Mendelssohn Prize(1933), Fine Arts Quartet Composition Award (1951), a Guggenheim Fellowship(1966), grants from the Fromm Foundation, the National Endowment for the Arts and "Meet the Composer"; his most recent commissions are from the International Horn Society, the International Trumpet Guild and the National Association of College Wind and Percussion Instructors.

His works have been performed by the Detroit, Chicago, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Rochester and Saint Louis Symphony Orchestras, the New York Philharmonic and Radio Difussion, Paris; the Budapest Quartet, Beaux Arts Trio, New York Woodwind Quintet, Los Angeles Brass. His opera "The Dakened City" received two productions by the Indiana University Opera Theatre.
